Overall, though, the series had a feeling of familiarity and was comforting, that is, what I attempted to capture in these similes.</p>
<p>The series feels like the whoosh of the wind and push and pull of forces as the rollercoaster climbs and plummets.</p>	
<p>The series tastes like the salt water of tears, the sweetness and crunch of fairy bread and a juicy watermelon.</p>	
<p>The series sounds like water gurgling in a swamp and the sound of a hammer pounding on metal.</p>	
<p>The series smells like yeasty bread baking in the oven and freshly bitten apple.</p>
